Monday: Diary Entry						
Add another entry to your diary about what you have been up to this week. Try to remember as much as possible and don't leave out a single detail. Have you been able to talk to anyone outside of your house? To other members of the family or neighbours? You can talk about if you have done your learning and if you have enjoyed it, found it easy or hard etc. Tell us how you are/have been feeling? Have you received a phone call from your teacher this week? How did that make you feel?						
Tuesday: Plan your instructions						
Think about something that you want to teach someone to make. This could be making a jam sandwich or baking a						
cake. Draw a picture of what it is that you are going to make and label it so that they know what the outcome						
should look like. Then, write a list of all of the things that you will need in order to make it.						
Wednesday: Write your instructions						
Try and think of as many imperative verbs as you can for your directions.						
Imperative verbs are sometimes called 'bossy' verbs as they are telling you to do something. E.g. cut, slice,						
put, mix, spread						
Have a go at writing your set of instructions to make your creation. Don't forget that you need to number your						
steps.						
<b>EXT:</b> Can you include adverbs in your instructions to tell your person <b>how</b> they are to complete the instruction.						
Thursday: Edit and Improve your instructions						
Can you add in time adverbials to your instructions to show order in your steps?						
Time adverbials tell you when something is happening. E.g. First, Then, Next, After, Afterwards, Now						

Go through your instructions and try and include a time adverbial to your instructions. Then, re-read through your instructions and make sure that you have not missed out any important instructions. A good way to make sure of this is to imagine you are making it only following your instructions and see if you get stuck on what to do or how to do it.

#### Friday: Follow your instructions

Today you (and your person) are going to try and make your creation only following your instructions. You cannot do anything unless your instructions tell you to!

If you realise you have missed anything out in your instructions, you must go back to them and edit them until you have successfully made your creation.
