



Tuesday:



Rivers

If you have access to the Internet, research the River Blackwater (a local river that is in Essex and leads to the Blackwater Estuary). Draw a map of the River Blackwater, the course it takes from Saffron Waldon, label various landmarks and river vocabulary too! (See above as an example of some of the key words to do with rivers).

If you don't have access to the Internet, draw a map of your local area and write down examples of all the man-made features that are around. This could be local landmarks, housing estates, sculptures and statues – anything that is not natural but is made by humans!

Fizzy Volcano

You'll Need:

- Vinegar
- A plastic container
- Baking Soda
- Paper towels (in case you make a mess!)

Instructions:

- 1. Put the baking soda into the container, then add some vinegar
- 2. Watch the fizzing reaction happen!

Why?

The vinegar is an <u>acid</u>, which means a reaction occurs when it is mixed with baking soda, which is <u>alkaline</u>. Their reaction creates carbonic acid, which causes all the fizzing.
