There will then be a delivery to the Community Centre on Brooklands from 12.15 - 12.30.

Please remember to wear a mask when you come to collect lunches and maintain the 2 metre Social Distancing guidance.

Thank you again for your ongoing support. These are challenging times and I know that everyone is doing their very best in difficult circumstances. The most important thing, as always, is that your children are safe. Although we will be monitoring who attends the Remote Learning sessions and we may contact you if your child does not log on, this is primarily because we want to check that your family are safe and well. It is, however, important that all children engage in the Remote Learning, either through logging on to the live sessions or by completing the work in their own time. This will ensure children do not fall behind their peers and it will also help maintain routine and consistency during these unprecedented times.
