This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. ### **Curriculum Music: Part A**

At **SMFA** we follow a curriculum which broadly echoes that of the model music curriculum (March 2021) but is developed to include up to date changes in the industry, teacher specialisms and equipment.

Our curriculum includes the following:

- 1h weekly lessons
- Singing
- Listening
- Composing
- Performing/Instrumental Performance
- Solo/Duet Opportunities
- Class instrumental ensembles
- Song writing
- Improvisation
